Legal Research Essentials for Students

Session Objectives

The session introduces new Westlaw (Australia) and focuses on navigating the site to locate legal content. The session explains how to use the Global Search to locate information quickly. Search techniques using both Natural Legal Language and Terms and Connectors to search for Cases, Journals and Commentary will be discussed. Downloading and exporting content will also be covered.

Note: We recommend this course as an overview at the start of your degree, or a refresher of the basics in the later years of your degree.

 - How to find a product/database

- Filter and refine search results
- Download, print and email information
